Harbourfront Centre Celebrates the Return of Toronto's Leading International Children's Festival, JUNIOR, with Exhilarating Program Line-up

JUNIOR offers a wide variety of multidisciplinary performances, workshops, interactive and inclusive events for kids and their adults at Harbourfront Centre's annual three-day children's festival

TORONTO, ON – **Harbourfront Centre** announces the highly anticipated, in-person return of one of Canada's largest international children's festivals, **JUNIOR**. Running throughout the May long weekend, from **May 21–23**, **2022**, at both indoor and outdoor venues on Harbourfront Centre's spacious campus, the festival offers a variety of free and ticketed activities for the entire family, including four Canadian premiere performances from international artists. Centered around themes of belonging and community, JUNIOR explores what it means to be connected to one another and our communities when the need for personal connection has never been so crucial to our collective mental health and well-being. Designed to engage and inspire the minds of children ages 4 to 14, the festival is co-curated by **Nathalie Bonjour**, Harbourfront Centre's Director, Performing Arts and **Mary Francis Moore**, an award-winning theatre artist and Artistic Director of Hamilton's Theatre Aquarius.

"After two years of disconnection, in which we were unable to gather in person, we are faced with an incredible opportunity to reunite and reflect on our experiences, both individually and collectively," says Mary Francis Moore, JUNIOR co-curator. "As the pandemic has been an especially difficult experience for children, JUNIOR offers kids and their parents an outlet to explore these complex emotions and ask big questions: What does it mean to belong? What is community? Is it a place, a feeling, or a group of people? Through an incredibly diverse program line-up featuring some of the world's most talented creators for young people, JUNIOR will offer new and unexpected opportunities for children to connect with themselves, their families, their peers and, most importantly, have fun!"

"We are incredibly proud to re-launch our annual JUNIOR Festival at Harbourfront Centre this May long weekend," adds Nathalie Bonjour, JUNIOR co-curator and Harbourfront Centre's Director, Performing Arts. "In an effort to further augment our audiences' festival experience in 2022, Harbourfront Centre has committed to enhancing inclusion, accessibility and diversity in our programming, building Indigenous programming, and improving accessibility through ASL interpretation, relaxed performances, audio description and *Pay What You Wish* ticket pricing. We can't wait to welcome families, both new and returning, to experience the transformative power and magic of the arts at JUNIOR."

The multidisciplinary festival program features a comprehensive line-up of ticketed and free performances, workshops and interactive activities, including various disciplines of theatre, dance, music, circus, food, storytelling, film and visual arts. Spotlight performances and activities include the Ontario premiere of *Sky Dancers* from Quebec's **A'no:wara Dance Theatre** about the Quebec bridge disaster of 1907, which killed 33 Mohawk ironworkers; the virtuosic fusion of African live music and circus arts in *Won'Ma Africa* from Quebec's **Kalabanté Productions**; an inclusive and playful orchestral concert from Toronto's **Queer Songbook Orchestra** and a brand-new **Indigenous food program**, curated by 50/50 Performing Arts, with food workshops led by Indigenous creatives, among many other highlights.

The festival will also feature several Nordic Spotlight presentations, including four Canadian theatrical premieres from Denmark's **Kitt Johnson X-act** and **Teatret Gruppe 38**, Greenland's **National Theatre of Greenland** and Finland's **Other Spaces**. Nordic Spotlights, which also includes JUNIOR's first official **LEGO® Zone** from Denmark, is part of **Nordic Bridges**, a year-long initiative that will connect hundreds of creators from Canada and the Nordic Region throughout 2022 in an exchange of art, culture and ideas from coast to coast to coast.

In support of Harbourfront Centre's inclusive *Pay What You Wish* pricing model introduced in 2022, ticket buyers are encouraged to select the ticket price they wish to pay for each individual performance or event. Suggested ticket prices for JUNIOR indoor ticketed performances range from \$15–\$50 for adults. **Ages 14 and under are free** when accompanied by a paying adult. Registration is required for some workshops, with PWYW ticket prices starting at \$0.

Those Who Run in the Sky is a coming-of-age story from the National Theatre of Greenland. Adapted from the best-selling novel by Aviaq Johnson, it tells the story of Pitu, a young shaman who finds himself lost in the world of spirits and must use his powers to find his way back home to the world of the living, his family and his one true love. This performance is in close collaboration with Canadian and Greenlandic artists. This piece is performed in Kalaallisut (Greenlandic). English context will be provided. **Nordic Spotlight, part of Nordic Bridges.**
