# **Getting to Harbourfront Centre**


Harbourfront Centre's Main Building is located at 235 Queens Quay West, on the south side of Queens Quay West, where Lower Simcoe Street ends.

The Harbourfront Centre Theatre is at 231 Queens Quay West.

The Fleck Dance Theatre is located on the third floor of the Queens Quay Terminal building located at 207 Queens Quay West.

#### **Public Transit**

The closest accessible subway station is Union Station. If you are travelling from Union Station, go south down York Street from Union Station.

Turn right on Queens Quay West, travel west for about two minutes, and Harbourfront Centre will be on your left at 235 Queens Quay West.

#### **Streetcar**

Union Station is the closest accessible TTC station, and Harbourfront Centre is the name of the nearest streetcar stop. From Union Station, you can take either the 509 Harbourfront or 510 Spadina streetcar. The Harbourfront Centre stop is two stops west of Union Station.

# **Parking**

#### Lot P2: York Underground

The closest parking facility to all venues is underground, below Ontario Square, at 235 Queens Quay West. There are ten accessible parking spots available in this parking lot on multiple levels on the east side of the lot. All parking spaces are open on a first-come, first-served basis.

There is elevator access to each floor. After exiting the elevator on the Ground level, you will be inside the parking pavilion. The car park itself is indoors; however, you will have to exit the parking garage and go outdoors to access the venues at Harbourfront Centre. There is no direct indoor access.

There are multiple exits from the parking garage. Please note which exit you come out of to make finding your vehicle easier when you are ready to leave.

The main exit will take you to Ontario Square. Ontario Square is between the parking garage and the main building. If you go to the Fleck Dance Theatre, you may exit the parking lot via one of the secondary exits. These will lead you to Canada Square. Please note the area has fake grass (Astroturf) and can sometimes be slippery depending on the weather. Please come prepared to pay to park.


This is an image of the entrance to the parking garage at 235 Queens Quay West.



# **Main Building Lobby**

The entrance to the main building is through the North East doors. There is an info desk on the left hand side just inside these doors – ask a volunteer or staff person to direct you, if needed.

# **Venues**

# **Main Building**

(Also sometimes referred to as the Artport Building)

There is a wheelchair-accessible entrance at the northeast corner of the Main Building, which you can see from the street. There is a set of stairs (3 steps) and a ramp with railings on both sides. The entry doors are automatic.

Harbourfront Centre Volunteers will be at the ramp 30 minutes before, during and 30 minutes after events in the Main Building. Harbourfront Centre Security staff can assist if you need assistance getting up or down the ramp at other times when the building is open. You can contact them at (416) 973-4885.

# **Marilyn Brewer Community Space**


The Marilyn Brewer Community Space is inside the Main Building. The space will be set up differently depending on the event taking place. There are two ways to get to the area from the lobby.

#### **Ramp Access**


There is a ramp that leads to the Marilyn Brewer Community Space and the Brigantine Room on the left side. The ramp has handrails on both sides.

The ramp was renovated in 2023. The new layout starts with a 7200mm long ramp that is 1398mms wide. The ramp ends with a platform where guests make two 90-degree right turns and one 90-degree left turn.

After the left turn, a second ramp is 9000mms long and 1398mms wide. Both ramps have a 1:12 slope, railings on each side and tactile strips at the top and bottom. The flooring is linoleum.



These are images of the ramp from the lobby to the Marilyn Brewer Community Space.




# **Brigantine Room**

The Brigantine Room is also inside the Main Building and can be accessed from the Marilyn Brewer Community Space. If you use the ramp to get to the Marilyn Brewer Community Space, the entrance to the Brigantine Room will be on the left.



This an image of the entrance to the Brigantine Room from the Marilyn Brewer Community Space.


The Brigantine Room is another large open space. When you enter the room, there is a stage on the right side. This flexible space can be set up in various ways, and it may look different depending on the event.

### **West Vitrines**

A vitrine is a glass display case. There are eight vitrines in the west corridor of the Main Building. Each vitrine is approximately 36" tall, 36" wide, and 15" deep and enclosed behind a glass door. The bottoms of the vitrines are 36" from the floor.

From the main entrance, continue straight to the end of the lobby, then turn left to enter the west corridor. The vitrines are on the left side of this corridor.

# **West Bays**

The west bays are in the west corridor on the west wall opposite the vitrines. Each bay has large glass garage doors inside and outside, so on sunny days the corridor will be bright.

#### **Studio Theatre**

To access the Theatre using the stairs, the entrance is located off the Harbourfront Centre main lobby. Continue straight to the end of the hall, then turn left to face the west corridor.

The entrance to the Studio Theatre will be on your left.

Enter the double doors, and you will find yourself in a small landing area with red walls. Turn left or right to go up seven stairs, and you will be inside the theatre space.

## **Artport Gallery**

Continue south down the west corridor, past the vitrines, bays, washrooms and the Artport Gallery will be on your left. The gallery fills the space between the west corridor and the Craft corridor. The doors to the Artport Gallery are not power-automated but are kept open during gallery hours.

# Washrooms On The Main Floor Of The Main Building

There is a private, stand alone, accessible washroom that can be accessed via the West corridor. This washroom uses hand wave technology to open, close and lock/unlock the door. The washroom contains a toilet and sink, a child's changing table and an adult changing table and is large enough for a mobility device user and a caregiver. There is an emergency assistance button in the room if required.







# Washrooms On The Main Floor Of The Main Building

The universal washrooms that are accessed via the East or West corridors contain 2 accessible stalls. All accessible washrooms have doors that open via wave activated panels. Accessible Stalls in Universal Washrooms





The universal washrooms can be accessed via both the East and West corridors. The washroom uses hand wave technology to open and close the doors.

There is one accessible stall in each of the banks of stalls, for a total of 2 accessible stalls. The toilets in the stalls are somewhat low.

There is a child size change table in the accessible stalls.


The sinks in this washroom have automatic taps and dryers built into them.





#### **South Corridor**

You can get to the south corridor from the lobby by going through the west corridor. If you travel down the west corridor, past the vitrines, bays, washrooms and Artport Gallery, you will turn left into the south corridor.




This is a site map of the Harbourfront Centre Main Building, with the South Corridor location circled in red.

#### **Lakeside Terrace**

The Lakeside Terrace can be accessed from the south corridor by continuing south towards the harbour. A broad set of double doors will be open when the space is open for events.

#### **West Lawn**

The West Lawn can be accessed from the street (Queens Quay) or the building through the West Bays. Outside of the West Bays, there is a brick patio area. You must go down six stairs to get to the West Lawn from the patio.

# Accessible Route to the West Lawn

An accessible entrance to/from the West Lawn is available via a ramp to the south of the main building, by the Food Labs (the Food Labs building has a bright blue and black mural painted on it).

#### **North Orchard**

There are many areas on the West Lawn. The North Orchard is the treed area closest to the street (Queens Quay).

#### **Avenue of Trees**

The Avenue of Trees is the long line of trees closest to the Food Lab building, the one with the blue and black mural painted on it.

#### Stage in the Park

The Stage in the Park is situated in the middle of the West Lawn, between the North Orchard and the Avenue of Trees.

# West Lawn Performance and Activity Sites

During festivals and events, tents are placed around the West Lawn. Each tent will be marked with a sign that will identify performances and activities you would like to attend/participate in.

## **The Concert Stage**

At the southwest corner of the West Lawn area is a large outdoor concert venue. The seating is fixed, meaning it cannot be moved. If you walk past the Avenue of Trees, you will find the entrance. You will enter at the back of the seating area. There are many spots for mobility device users and their companions at the back of the seating area. There is a ramp at the centre back of the seating area to get to the accessible seats. Transfer seats are labelled with a dynamic wheelchair symbol.

The seating area is covered, but the sides are open meaning that the air flows freely through the seating area.

To the east of the Concert Stage is an open-air bistro called The Slip.

#### **Ground Surfaces**

There are a number of different ground surfaces throughout the West Lawn. There are bricks, stone pathways, wooden ramps, fake grass (Astroturf) and concrete areas. You will need to maneuver over these different ground styles to get to each West Lawn performance area

#### **West Lawn Washrooms**

Some washrooms can be accessed from the West Lawn without going inside the main building. The entrance to these washrooms is at ground level on the western wall of the Food Labs building. These washrooms are gendered. Accessible stalls are available in the "men's" and "women's" washrooms. The washroom doors will be propped open. The doors do not have buttons to open them.

#### **Food Lab**

The Food Lab building has a bright blue and black mural painted on it. This is the same building that contains the outdoor washrooms. Access to the Food Labs is on the upper level from the concrete ramp on the east end of the building.




This photo shows the access route to the Food Labs.

## **Public Square**

Outdoors, directly south of the Main Building, is the Public Square, serving as the focal point of the Harbourfront Centre campus and accessible from all directions at grade. The Square features illuminated bench seating areas on all four sides of the Public Square. On the southeast side, a larger seating area also functions as an event stage for various programming venues. Enhanced landscaping surrounds the Public Square on both the West and East sides, with over 30 new trees and real grass berms that provide natural shade on hot summer days. The square surface is made of permeable paving stones, ensuring full accessibility for all visitors.

Illumination is provided by four 30foot light poles, casting creative lighting schemes and ensuring high visibility at night. Additionally, the square features over 600 filtered water fog misters operated by Harbourfront Centre, offering visual effects and relief from hot summer days along the waterfront. On the north side of the Public Square, an accessible deck offers lake views and will host some Harbourfront Centre's seasonal programming. Bench-style seating is scattered throughout the deck, which is well lit with recessed rail lighting on all stairs and ramps, along with flushmounted lighting in key areas.

#### **Harbourfront Centre Theatre**

The Harbourfront Centre Theatre is inside a separate red brick building across the east laneway from the Main Building. The building address is 231 Queens Quay West, and it has a large smokestack coming out of its roof. The Power Plant Contemporary Art Gallery is also inside this building.

To get to the Harbourfront Centre
Theatre from the Main Building,
travel north to the Queens Quay
West sidewalk, then east past the
Main Building and past the entrance
to the parking garage. Turn south
towards the lake, and the building
will be on your right – there is
an entrance to the lobby on the
east side with automatic doors.

# **Harbourfront Centre Theatre (continued)**

#### **Ramp Access**

There is a long, curved ramp with railings on both sides. The ramp is 33.5" wide and can only fit one-way traffic for people using mobility devices.

Volunteers will be at the top and bottom of the ramp traffic for safety and aid if needed.

#### **Stairs**

There is also a set of eight stairs leading up to the theatre's doors.

On the right-hand side is the box office, on the left is a corridor leading to a set of washrooms, and the doors to the theatre lobby are straight ahead.

#### **Harbourfront Centre Theatre Washroom**

There are two gender-inclusive single-stall washrooms in the Harbourfront Centre Theatre building with the accessible sign on them and two other multistall washrooms marked Women's and Men's.

Please note that the doorways to both single stall washrooms are 28.5" wide.

If you enter the lobby from the east side of the building, there is a washroom on the right side.

There are two grab bars inside this washroom, one to the right and one behind the toilet. The tap has standard independent hot and cold controls and is not automatic.

#### **Washroom Access Note**

There is an automatic door opener about five feet to the right and just to the left of the bottom of the ramp. The doorway is 28.5" wide.

# Harbourfront Centre Theatre Washroom (continued)

Turn left when you get to the top of the ramp or stairs. Proceed down this small hallway to find another set of washrooms. Women's is on the left, Men's on the right, and a single-stall gender-inclusive washroom is straight ahead.

#### **Access Note**

The automatic door opener to open the washroom door is on the wall on your left when facing the door.




This is an image of the hallway leading to the washrooms in the Harbourfront Centre Theatre lobby.

#### **Harbourfront Centre Theatre Box Office**

From this landing, you will pass through a set of glass doors, turn to the right, pass through another door and be inside the Harbourfront Centre Theatre Lobby. The entrance to the theatre space is in this lobby. The lobby may be busy with other visitors to Harbourfront Centre, especially if an event is beginning or ending. There will be staff and volunteers to assist with directions and to get into the theatre.

#### **Balcony Access**

The balconies in the Harbourfront Centre Theatre are only accessible via stairs (no elevator access). If you are unable or would prefer not to use the stairs, please purchase a ticket on the main level or in the accessible seating section.

#### **Fleck Dance Theatre**

The Fleck Dance Theatre is a large theatre on the third floor of The Queen's Quay Terminal building. The building address is 207 Queens Quay West.

There are two main access points on the ground floor of this building.

The first access point is on the north side of the building, facing Queens Quay Road, just east of the Farm Boy grocery store. It is the closest access point to the sidewalk and TTC streetcar stops. There is an elevated entranceway with ramps at the east and west ends and four stairs. The entrance doors are power automated.

After going through the entrance, a security desk is straight ahead and to the right (on the west side of the hallway). This is a great place to ask if you have questions about getting to the Fleck Dance Theatre.

## Fleck Dance Theatre (continued)

The other access point is at the southwest corner of the building, next to the lakefront boardwalk and facing the Harbourfront Centre main campus.

There are four steps up to the entrance doors and a ramp at the west or left side of the entrance. Once you have entered the building, continue straight ahead until the hallway opens – there will be restaurants and a food court area on your right.

Continue past this area, and slightly to the left, there is an elevator with glass walls that can be used to access the 3rd floor, where the Fleck Dance Theatre is. There are fountains in this lobby so you will hear the sound of water.

# Fleck Dance Theatre (continued)

Once you reach the third floor, exit the elevator, and the box office is in front of you, slightly to the left. The entrance to the theatre lobby is ahead of you and slightly to the right. There are two windows for the Box Office – the one on the left is lowered.

#### Fleck Dance Theatre Washrooms

There is an accessible genderneutral washroom on the main level of the Queen's Quay Terminal, west of the south elevator bank. This washroom has an automatic door opener, a large turning radius, grab bars and a personal alarm system.

There are also gender-specific washrooms within the theatre that are partially accessible, including automatic door openers. When entering the Fleck Dance Theatre lobby travel straight inside the theatre. The Coat Check desk is on your left, and the gender-specific Women's and Men's multi-stall washrooms are on your right.

Audio Description is the descriptive narration of key visual elements in performances, events and media.



#### **Performance And Event Access Features**

#### **Braille**



#### **Captions**

Captions include information translated from sound to text and are a direct transcript of the language being used. Captions may be open (visible for everyone) or closed (allows the viewer to turn captions on and off).



#### **Live Captions**

Live, real-time captions will be provided for certain events.



#### **Chill Out Spaces**

A Chill Out Space is designed to reduce sensory stimulation and allow patrons to take a break from the main action of the event.



#### **Performance And Event Access Features**

#### **Relaxed Performance**

Relaxed Performances are designed to welcome audience members who may benefit from a less restrictive and more relaxed sensory environment. Relaxed Performances have a relaxed attitude to noise and movement, including leaving house lights on at a low level and allowing audience members to come and go as needed.



Fact Sheets may be available for the Relaxed Performance. They will provide details about access features, content warnings and descriptions and other information that may help patrons prepare for the event.

#### **Subtitles**

Surtitles are translated lyrics and dialogue projected above a stage or displayed on a screen.



#### **Touchable**

Certain visual arts exhibits will have touchable elements.
